- 26 responses

4. Discussion Homelessness Awareness

- Launch October 25, 2023
- Closed November 1, 2023
- 30 response

UNDERSTANDING HOMELESSNESS IN SCOTTSDALE QUESTIONNAIRE

Report Summary

Summary of the **Speak Up Scottsdale Community**questionnaire on **Homelessness in Scottsdale Questionnaire**was designed with 11 questions which included:

- Rating
- Choice
- Discussion

143 Speak Up Scottsdale community members fully answered the questionnaire.





UNDERSTANDING HOMELESSNESS IN SCOTTSDALE QUESTIONNAIRE

Report Summary Continued

Most **Speak Up Scottsdale Community Members** (57%) did not have personal experience with someone's struggle to find affordable housing.

 3.23 out of 5 members identified the issue of homelessness a serious problem.

Speak Up Scottsdale Community Members primarily defined homelessness as having no shelter or safe place, and the most common emotion they associated with homelessness was sadness.

The respondents' biggest concern was safety, among other issues such as affordable housing, needs for solutions, and concern for the individuals homeless themselves.


 3.14 out of 5 Respondents demonstrated moderate awareness of city programs to support those in need.

(72%) A large majority of Speak Up Scottsdale Members supported the city pursuing grant funding or partnering with non-profits to address homelessness, and there was interest in more information about the city's programs and services to combat homelessness.



KNOW OF OR HAVE EXPERIENCE WITH SOMEONE WHO IS OR HAS STRUGGLED TO FIND AFFORDABLE HOUSING.

Of the 143 Speak Up Scottsdale Members 82 of respondents indicated *No*, while 61 of respondents indicated *Yes* that they know of or have experience with someone who is or has struggled to find affordable housing.










THOUGHTS ON HOMELESSNESS IN SCOTTSDALE

59 respondents felt the problem of homelessness in Scottsdale is a moderate problem.









DEFINING HOMELESSNESS

The community characterized Homelessness as the chronic instability and inability to secure long-term accommodation.

It encompasses a range of conditions from living on streets, in cars, or in shelters, to the inability to secure permanent housing.

The community indicated that homelessness may manifest because of financial insufficiency, addiction, mental illness, adverse familial circumstances or unfortunate life situations.

It includes people lacking resources or facing barriers in obtaining affordable housing.

Those affected may be unable to ensure consistent accessibility to essentials like food and sleeping arrangements besides coping with frequent insecurity over their next 6-month term.



EMOTIONS ASSOCIATED WITH HOMELESSNESS

The responses collected about emotions associated with homelessness reveal a range of strong emotions.

Dominant feelings include empathy and compassion towards homeless individuals, with many expressing sadness and helplessness at the scale of the issue.

Personal experience significantly shaped understanding for many respondents.

There was also strong sentiment about societal responsibility towards homelessness, with perceived inaction being a common concern.

Despite the challenging nature of the issue, some members expressed hope and a desire to help tackle homelessness.





The following themes surfaced:










TACKLING HOMELESSNESS

104 respondents said Yes to the City of Scottsdale pursing grant funding or nonprofit partnerships to tackle homelessness.










LEARNING MORE ABOUT SCOTTSDALES HOMELESSNESS PROGRAMS AND SERVICES

Twenty-five community members took part in the discussion on homelessness and provides twenty-eight comments.









- 8. Specialized services & support programs



- 4. Sustainable solutions and self-reliance
- 5. The role of government and policy
- 6. Overcoming NIMBY (not in my backyard) attitudes and fostering inclusivity
- 7. Efficacy of outreach efforts and collaboration
- 8. Addressing public health concerns and financial implications


